Application for Membership

Applications may be picked up from the Secretary or Treasurer of the club. Extra copies are kept in the cabinet at Castaway Bay. Application is accompanied by the Financial Commitment-Dues and Assessments information sheet, which gives the prospective member approximate schedule of yearly charges.

Submit Application

Completed (signed by both the sponsor and the proposed new member) applications are returned to the secretary or treasurer who then forwards it to the Classification Committee (Mike Prout) for approval. This committee chairman assigns a classification, in writing, and returns the application with the classification letter to the secretary. A name badge is then given to the secretary to hold until induction.

Board Approval

Once Classification has approved proposed member, the Board of Directors needs to approve the name for circulation. The club secretary then prepares the proposal form and puts it on each table for a regularly scheduled meeting. After seven days, if no objection is received by the club president, the member is ready to be inducted. (Note: proposed member needs to attend three meetings before proposal is put on the tables.)

Induction

The member that is sponsoring the new member needs to schedule the induction with the club president. The club president informs the Sergeant at Arms to prepare the induction package.
